Note from Code Enforcement

- All RV's/Motor Homes are not to be parked in front of the house in residential neighborhoods. All RV's and Motorhomes should be parked behind the home past the back line of the house.
- No one is to be living in an RV or motorhome in a residential neighborhood.
- Due to the possibility of mosquito breeding sites, all outside containers that can hold water should be turned upside down or removed from the premises. This will lower the risk of being bitten and the spreading of virus such as the West Nile virus.
